## Dissertation

### Laugh Hard at the Absurdly Evil: Humor as Social Tool

Humor is weird; Richard Pryor used humor to challenge racist stereotypes, while the neighborhood bully uses derisive laughter to enforce their superiority. Philosophers generally identify humor with a psychological capacity or response. However, existing psychological accounts are insufficient for capturing humor’s communicative function because what humor *does* can come apart from an individual-psychological level explanation of what humor “is.” I introduce an alternative model of humor as a cultural technology for revealing, reinforcing, and challenging social norms; I also show how my model reframes first-order debates regarding the ethics of jokes.
